Government House Visit

Yesterday lunchtime thirty members of our Association arrived with anticipation at this lovely house and were welcomed in the very pleasant, spacious hallway by no less than the Lieutenant Governor, Sir John Lorimer, himself. After introductions Sir John went on to explain something about the history of the house it being built as Bemahague Farm in the early 19th century. Prior to this the land was strongly associated with the Christian family and the Heywood family. Previous official residence of the Governor had included Lorne House in Castletown (when Castletown was the capital), Castle Mona and even the Villa Marina area. The first Governor tenant of the present house was Sir Keith Loch (we all know Loch Promenade), a popular and well-respected Governor who did a lot for the Island. The present house with all its extensions is now used to provide accommodation for official guests and holds many official functions throughout the year, including many visits from various local groups as well as school visits. We were all impressed by his knowledge of the house and the Isle of Man in general. Sir John then took us through the public rooms on the ground floor offering information on each room as we went. The dining room, a beautiful long spacious room with a sprung floor could sit 24 people though he considered 16 to be 'comfortable to talk to' maximum number. It apparently has a lovely floor for dancing! My favourite room was the lounge with its beautiful bay window. The last room visited was the library and again Sir John gave us interesting information and anecdotes about it. We then all went back to the first room for tea and cakes and to continue chatting. The Lieutenant Governor left us at this point to go and get the boat! This was a very worthwhile event.
